We do not accept liability arising in such circumstances, as our responsibility is limited to the preparation of your tax return based on information that you provide to us.

It is therefore important that you review your return carefully to ensure that it is "true, correct and complete" before you provide your signature as certification on the return or the electronic filing authorization. It is also important that you retain tax slips, receipts, invoices, and other documentary evidence for income, expenses, deductions, and tax credits reported in your tax return should the CRA require these in the event of an audit. It is your responsibility to ensure that any expenses claimed in your tax return are reasonable in the circumstances.
